

Introduction:

We follow the English National Curriculum for teaching of the core subjects, English, Math, and Science as well as PE. In Early Years, we use the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) curriculum.

- We aim for a balanced curriculum where academics is balanced with the arts and sport. The school's enrichment program compliments our curriculum by offering students to widen and deepen their interests.
- Our curriculum is delivered in secondary school by specialist teachers for all subjects.
- Our curriculum is delivered to students in primary school by a class teacher for most of their time except for specialist lessons (Science, Computing and PE)
- Our curriculum is further enhanced with a focus on STEAM and entrepreneurship.
- For the teaching of phonics, we follow Read, Write, Inc. in Early Years and primary school. N (FS1), R (FS2), Y1 – Y5 have daily phonics sessions.
- Throughout the year the curriculum is further enriched by theme weeks such as Enterprise Week, International Week and Health Week.

- The curriculum aims to promote the values of the UAE identity

Enrichment Activities

Enrichment refers to the school's integrated (previously the after school ECA program). The aim is to provide a balanced range of additional school activities for students of all ages to further develop and enrich our curriculum.

- Heads of School coordinate the enrichment program.
- Programs are led by school staff and are all provided free of charge to parents.
- Programs run half-termly for between 5-6 weeks depending on the term.

Curriculum Policy

- Information for the next- half-term's program is shared with children during the last 3 weeks of each half-term to allow them to register their interests.

After School Activities (ASAs):

After school activities offer students further opportunities (in addition to the free Enrichment program) to participate in broader and more varied programs. These programs are voluntary and are paid for programs as they are provided by external vendors and/or are provided outside school hours.
